

Reflection Questions for Project and Country Profiles PIIRS FY17 data

The Excel file “PIIRS FY17 CO summaries” contains 2 sheets. The first sheet is labeled “FY17 Project Summary” and contains a project-level report for an individual project reported in PIIRS (using the dropdown menus at the top to select country and project of interest). The second sheet is labeled “FY17 PIIRS Country Summary” and contains a country-level report for all projects reported in PIIRS for FY17. Below are some questions that you and your team can reflect on while reviewing the summaries.

As you are reviewing the Project Summary Sheet-Select a project of interest for your country office

- What was your project’s contribution to reach in your country selected?
- Which program strategy outcomes did your project contribute to? Are these the areas that you expected?
- What percentage of participants in your project were women? If this % is blank, did your project collect gender disaggregated data?
- How does your project compare to the country and region distributions on the gender, governance, and resilience marker scores?
- Is your project description information accurate?

As you are reviewing the Country Summary Sheet

- Looking at the number of projects reported in FY17, does this reflect the actual number of existing projects in your country?
- Assess where your country falls on levels of advocacy, innovation, scale up compared to the region and globally. What do you find?
- Program Quality Check: Assess aspects of program quality your country reported for FY17. What is your country doing differently than the region?
- Gender, governance, and resilience marker scores: Take a look at your FY17 marker scores. Are there any ideas/thoughts about how country/regional/global scores might be higher/lower?
- How might this data inform your country strategy?
- How can you see using some of this information inform your regional strategy?
- Was there anything surprising in these country profiles?
- How else would you want to see PIIRS data? What other information would you want?
