WHAT DO WE MEAN BY KML?

Knowledge management is about capturing, creating, distilling, sharing and using know-how. At CARE, knowledge management and learning (KML) connects people and ideas to learn and innovate for greater impact. This involves: People and organizational culture; KM processes; and KM technology. Together, they enable CARE and our partners to generate, organize, share and use knowledge and learning across our global organization.



WHY IS KML IMPORTANT?

To increase our impact, through using evidence and learning to influence policy and practice

To improve resource mobilization, by being able to show better our global experience and effectiveness

To make our work more efficient, reducing the thousands of hours wasted re-inventing wheels or trying to find critical information



WHAT DOES EFFECTIVE KML LOOK LIKE?

We are already seeing KML successes, using our evidence and learning for multiple purposes:

- Facilitating the learning of others (social learning)
- Influencing broader social change (influencing policies & programs of government, private sector, etc)
- · Strengthening our staff and partner capacity
- Adapting to changes in the context
- Mobilizing resources and partnerships
